

Dr. Caroline Kaeb

Dr. Caroline Kaeb is a Foreign Legal Adviser at Masuda Funai Eifert & Mitchell, Ltd., where she consults on issues of European business law, corporate compliance and corporate matters. She is a Senior Lecturer on information communication technology and human rights at Loyola University School of Law. She recently served as the UN deputy special expert on UN assistance to the Khmer Rouge trials. Dr. Kaeb also spearheads the development of normative criteria and operational guidelines for corporate engagement with public policy issues (in collaboration with the Office of the U.N. High Commissioner for Human Rights) and the development of a new funding mechanism for the work for the International Criminal Court and its Trust Fund for Victims.

Previously, Dr. Kaeb was an Assistant Professor of Business Law and Human Rights at UConn School of Business, where she held a joint appointment with the Human Rights Institute. Her research applies a human rights methodology to questions of corporate responsibility, social impact, and corporate compliance. She is particularly interested in related normative questions of corporate law (including about the nature of the firm and corporate personality), business ethics, and behavioral regulatory design. Dr. Kaeb's work has been featured in the *Northwestern Journal of International Law and Business*, *Berkley Journal of International Law*, *American Journal of International Law*, and *Harvard International Law Journal*, among others. Dr. Kaeb held visiting faculty positions at Northwestern University Pritzker School of Law and the University of Chicago Harris School of Public Policy and was an affiliated faculty member at the Ford Motor Company Center for Global Citizenship and the Kellogg School of Management (2013-2014). In 2015, she was a visiting researcher with the Department of Legal Affairs and Integrity (Corporate Responsibility Management) at Daimler AG in Stuttgart, Germany. She recently took up a visiting academic position at LUISS School of Business in Rome, Italy, researching corporate sustainability matters.

Dr. Kaeb is a founding member and co-chair of the Working Group on Business and Human Rights with the UN Global Compact's Principles for Responsible Management Education (PRME). She is a member of the academic constituency of GNI, in which she has been engaged since 2010 in different capacities; currently, she assists in revamping GNI's company assessment and assessor guidance materials. Dr. Kaeb also serves as a member on the advisory board of the American Bar Association's Business and Human Rights Project, a Distinguished Fellow of the Searle Center on Law, Regulation, and Economic Growth at Northwestern University, and a member of the governance committee of the Columbia University Teaching Business and Human Rights Forum.
