1. Doctoral Dissertation for the Wharton PhD in Criminology. ***Terrorism as a Rational Tactic – An International Study***. Logistic regressions using ITERATE III database. The expansive study covered 10,837 terrorist incidents worldwide over a 26-year period. It identified factors that helped explain the rationality of terrorist tactics. The study developed two models to predict terrorist success and to explain the success of CT measures. The dissertation was in Public Policy and Management for the Graduate Group in Managerial Science and Applied Economics.

2. Doctoral Dissertation for the Doctorate of Juridical Science. ***Cybermedicine - The Future of The Law of Medicine in Cyberspace***. A ground-breaking study of the law of medicine in cyberspace focusing on protection of patient data derived from analysis of state legislations and the common law on medical malpractice.

Fazal is a protégé of Professors Marvin Wolfgang, William S. Laufer, Harold Bershad, del Duca, Carla Pratt and Michael Mogill. He has served as Research Assistant at the Center for Studies in Criminology and Criminal Law at the Wharton School of the University of Pennsylvania. His joint research with Wolfgang on global crime trends as part of the International Violence project for United Nations' Social Defense Division and the longitudinal study on the Philadelphia Birth Cohort contributed to the emerging field of bio-social criminology. He consults for the Federal Department of Justice. He has served as Intelligence Analyst for the Middle Atlantic Great Lakes Organized Crime Law Enforcement Network. He volunteers for communities' enlightenment holding seminars and workshops on Social Ethics, Youth Development, Religious Tolerance and practical lessons on Social Justice of the Quran throughout the country with the aim persuasively replacing radical thought in youth.

Fazal's two ground breaking doctoral dissertations have seen major extraordinary real world applications: The one on international terrorism, a pre-9/11 quantitative study covering over two decades of global data is a seminal contribution on the analysis of terrorist rationality. The other seminal study using legal analysis is a futuristic study of the law of the practice of medicine in cyberspace which he calls Cybermedicine.
